School Info

ELA: The William S. Greene Elementary School will increase the number of students meeting and exceeding expectations from 39% to 44 % via the implementation of a tiered system of literacy supports promoting differentiated instruction of core and intervention instruction.

Math: The William S. Greene Elementary School will increase the percentage of students meeting or exceeding standards on the 2018-2019 MCAS by 5% from 31 - 36 % via the implementation of a tiered system of numeracy supports promoting differentiated instruction.

SEL: Greene Elementary School will increase the percentage of students responding Tier II PBIS initiatives by reducing their office referrals by 5% by consistently implementing the PBIS framework, Responsive Classroom programming and SEL Framework with fidelity.

GREENE STAFF ADDITIONAL JUSTIFICATION

Social and Emotional Learning Paraprofessional: At Greene, we have many students who have extensive social-emotional needs. It is our request to add and assign one or two paraprofessionals to the role of social and emotional learning paraprofessionals. Based on feedback from other elementary schools the roles have been amazing in supporting students for short to long periods of time. The design is that these paraprofessionals are pushing into classrooms to support students proactively with applying skills and strategies to allow for learning to occur. This is an opportunity for these paraprofessionals to support students with engagement, building positive relationships, showing gratitude, and a variety of other social and emotional competencies. Unfortunately, because the need within classrooms is so high for our population of students

School Adjustment Counselor: (SAC) At this time we have two School Adjustment Counselors at Greene for 750 students. The American School Counselor Association suggests a student-to-student-counselor ratio of 1 to 250. The current ratio for our student adjustment counselors is close to a 1 to 375 ratio. With the increasing social and emotional needs of our students and the involved job of our counselors, it is important that we have the staff needed to meet all the needs of our students and also fill the responsibilities that the student adjustment counselor role comes with. The counselor role involves small group work, one-on-one work with students, chairing 504 meetings, conducting bullying investigations, working closely with community agencies, delivering whole class instruction relative to social and emotional learning, facilitating professional development, responding to crisis, and a variety of other duties that contribute to the successful operation of a school. By adding an additional SAC we would be more in line with the recommended student to counselor ratio which would allow for more support for our students and more time for SAC's to fulfill all the duties of their job.

Math Department Head

Greene needs to add an MDH due to low achievement in mathematics which resulted in the lowest-performing including ELL and Special ed, students at Greene underachieving on all formative and summative assessments including MCAS. The amount of children and teachers needing support in mathematics far exceeds the resources currently in the building. An MDH would specialize in mathematics, assist in our turnaround plan priorities and be utilized to support and assist classroom teachers with content and content-specific pedagogy that effectively supports students in meeting the standards identified in the Massachusetts Curriculum Frameworks.

Additional Responsibilities:

- To provide leadership, coordination, and innovation to assigned curricular areas.
- In conjunction with the curriculum directors, coordinates the development and implementation of district curriculum objectives:
- Teaches one class in the area of certification.
- Evaluates all staff as determined by Principal.
- Assists teachers in resolving instructional problems and serves as a resource on curriculum questions.
- Checks lesson plans regularly to ensure that curriculum requirements are being met and that necessary materials are available
- Makes recommendations on curriculum development, implementation, assessment, and program innovation.
- Assists in the recruitment, screening, hiring, training, and assigning of staff.
- Provides in-service training, and assigning of staff, based on the needs identified in both district and school improvement plans.
- Assists in developing and utilizing community resources for department needs.
- Keeps abreast of progress and new developments in the field of specialty.
- Is responsible for collecting results official assessments and documentation necessary for school improvement plan implementation.
